Report on 2017 Winter Overnight Shelter

For over 16 years, St. Julie's has been part of a network of churches and synagogues that serves the disadvantaged in our community. Every Saturday night, homeless or economically challenged individuals and families come to the parish center for a free meal. During the winter months of December – March, our parish also provides an overnight shelter, giving those with no place to stay a warm, dry roof over their heads.

This year the overnight portion of our program set another record in terms of the number of individuals seeking shelter each weekend. Over a four-month period, we served 1,100 dinners and had 570 overnight stays. This averaged out to over 65 people a night for dinner with 34 or more staying to spend the night. As we progressed through the season, our numbers escalated. On our busiest weekend, a cold and rainy night in February, we served 92 meals and had 41 people spend the night. Over half of our overnight guests were seniors and one third were women.

The overnight portion of our ministry takes an enormous amount of volunteer help. In addition to serving a full course dinner, the hall later needs to be rearranged into sleeping quarters with separate areas for women, women with children and couples. In the morning, after providing our guests a light breakfast and lunch for the day, the hall has to be quickly readied for Sunday services. Our many volunteers included those that cooked and served the meals, hosts who coordinated each Saturday night program, greeters who welcomed and registered participants, volunteers who prepared and handed out bedding, chaperones who spent the night, straighteners who came early Sunday morning to clean the hall, and volunteers who did each week's laundry of bedding and towels – approximately 30 loads per week.

Thank you to all who helped this winter. With everyone pitching in, from seniors to teens, scouts, Knights and everyone else, we were able to provide wholesome food and a safe shelter during the coldest and wettest months of the year. Also, a big Thank You to St. Julie's community in general for your donations to our ministry and overall understanding and support of our mission.

Our ministry continues during the warmer months, providing dinners each Saturday night at 6pm. These dinners are free and open to all. Many of the folks who attend have homes but are on fixed incomes. If you know someone who could use a nice hot meal, please let him or her know about this program.

St. Julie Billiart Safeguard the Children Committee

The St. Julie Billiart Parish Safeguard the Children Committee is a group of lay volunteers, clergy and staff formed as part of a mandated Archdiocesan-wide effort to assist in preventing sexual abuse of children in parish settings and at parish sponsored events. The Committee consists of parishioners Ed Roes, Committee Chair; and members Barry and Carolyn Dydyk, Richard Gaz, and Ric Donovan. Clergy and staff members include Father Paul Hruby; Deacon Dave Smith, Director of Faith Formation; and Daryl Hitt, Youth Ministry Coordinator.

In this role, the Committee's goals are to:

- 1) Monitor Archdiocesan Policies and Procedures to ensure parish compliance with safeguard initiatives found in the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People;
- 2) Ensure that all adults and those who work with children have attended the VIRTUS® Adult Child Sexual Prevention Programs and strive to achieve the goal that all children and young people have been educated in one of the Archdiocesan-approved safe environment programs;
- 3) Evaluate the parish buildings and grounds on an on-going basis to ensure a safe environment for our children and young people; and,
- 4) Review and recommend parish-wide safe environment policies and procedures that provide for the safety of our children and young people.

The protection of children and young people here at St. Julie's is our highest priority. Specifically, the following policies have been in place at our parish for more than a decade:

- A zero tolerance policy. No one with a credible allegation of child abuse may function in ministry in the parish and the Archdiocese of Los Angeles;
- Fingerprinting and background checks. Anyone who works in close proximity with children or young people in the parish and diocese has to be fingerprinted. In total, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles has fingerprinted 149,000 clergy, religious, staff and volunteers;
- VIRTUS® Teaching Touching Safety. Each year students enrolled in our religious education program participate in a safe environment programs to help promote awareness and teach them about boundaries and how to find a safe adult to talk to if something is bothering them. This past year 184 parish children received training.
- VIRTUS® Protecting God's Children and Keeping the Promise Alive. All clergy, staff and volunteers who work with or around minors are required to be VIRTUS® trained and recertified every four years on how to protect children and young people from child sexual abuse as well as how to report abuse.

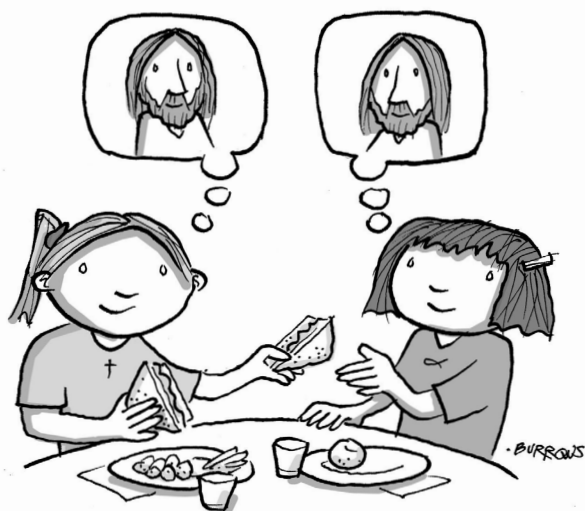
DID YOU KNOW?

Since 2002, the Archdiocese has trained 300,000 adults and more than 1.4 million children.
